Article 4.2

Current bylaw:

2. Annual General Meeting

- a) The October meeting of the Board shall be the AGM.
- b) The Annual General Meeting will be held at a location in Canada determined and agreed to by the Board of Directors

Proposed amendment:

Delete a) in its entirety.

b) The Annual General Meeting will be held on a day and at a location in Canada determined and agreed to by the Board of Directors. Where possible, the AGM will be held in conjunction with a club event.

Explanation for the proposed amendment:

Right now the AGM must be held in the month of October. It would be preferable if there was more flexibility with the AGM date so that it could possibly be held in conjunction with another club event, resulting in better attendance at the AGM.

2008 Breeder Directory

In order to be listed on the Vizsla Canada Breeders Directory, the breeder must be a Regular or Life Member in good standing of Vizsla Canada, to prevent backyard breeders from joining Vizsla Canada for the sole purpose of using our club to sell puppies. The breeder must also agree to the following conditions:

All breeding stock must be certified clear of hip dysplasia by OFA, OVC, PennHIP or other certifying institution approved by Vizsla Canada. If the breeder is a Canadian resident, breeding stock and puppies must be registered with the CKC. If the breeder is not a Canadian resident, breeding stock and puppies must be registered in a stud book recognized by the Canadian Kennel Club. The breeder agrees to be responsible for all puppies he has bred and to accept their dogs back from buyers who are no longer able to keep them.

The persons on this list have paid to have their name advertised here. This list is not a comprehensive list of Vizsla breeders in Canada. Inclusion on this list does not imply that these breeders are better than those not listed.

Introducing a Puppy to Birds

This is the season for puppies! I was lucky enough to get a vizsla pup in the spring and have been enjoying all her cuteness, and watching her experience new things for the first time. In this article I will describe how I have learned to introduce vizsla puppies to birds and gunfire. I was taught this method from people that have owned and trained vizslas for many years. I am sure there are other methods to do this, and if you've found another method more successful I'd love to hear about it! If you have someone experienced that can guide you in these first critical introductions then please utilize them. Above all make each bird contact a fun positive experience for your puppy.

Pigeons are great birds for the first few introductions, they are small and fairly docile and they usually fly well. I have also heard many people like to use Quail, although they may be hard to come by in your area. I have been lucky enough to have wonderful friends that keep a coop full of homing pigeons for dog training, and own 20 acres of land perfect for using those pigeons for training.

For the first few times your puppy meets birds take a pigeon and holding it firmly move it around on the ground so puppy is excited and trying to pounce/catch it. Then toss the bird low to the ground and away from the pup so it flies. This gets the pup really interested in the bird while introducing the flapping of bird wings at a distance from the pup. The bird flying away seems to stimulate prey drive which helps the pup overcome any concern he/she may feel about the flapping wings. That might be all we do the first session with live birds, especially if we notice the pup is a little nervous.

When your puppy is young you want every experience with birds to be a positive one. How soft or sensitive your puppy is will determine how you set up these first few encounters. If your puppy spooks easily then knitting the pigeons wings together by interlacing their flight feathers will keep the birds from flushing up and startling your pup. Tease your pup with the bird; let him/her become excited and interested in the smell and feathers. Make it lots and lots of fun!

Once your puppy is confident and excited about birds we have someone dizzy them just a little and plant them 'lightly' where the puppy can smell them, flush them and chase them. Puppies learn to use their noses from experience, and their prey drive will kick in when the pigeon flies away. Some puppies will chase the pigeon for awhile before they realize they cannot catch them while others may stand and watch them fly off with great interest.

Again depending on the temperament of your puppy you will repeat their bird experiences until they are excited and happy to find birds. Then you can VERY CAREFULLY start to introduce gunfire to your pup. The way we introduce pups to gunfire is to fire a low caliber starter pistol or cap gun into the ground from far away while the pup is in full chase mode behind a bird.

As the pup gets used to the noise the gun can be fired away from the ground so it is louder, and then slowly closer, to the puppy every time they chase a bird. If they react poorly to the noise you have progressed too fast. Take things very slowly at this stage, **it is much more difficult to fix a dog that is gun-shy then to prevent it in the first place.**

During the first year of your puppy's life lots and lots of bird contact which is always a positive experience is the key to a happy hunting dog. When they get a little older and have the drive to find birds then serious training can start. Above all enjoy watching the amazing instinctive ability of your pup to find and point birds and just watch how much your puppy loves these exercises!



Have you ever watched the “dream teams” in the obedience ring and sighed, “Wish I had THAT dog!”? Guess what, you DO have that dog – he goes home with you every day, and goes to practice with you every chance he gets! Your dog can be a solid performer if you follow a few simple rules.

Rule number one. Every time you are with your dog, you are training your dog. If your dog ignores you in the yard when you call him into the house, why would you think he’d come in an obedience trial when there are a million interesting distractions around?

Rule number two. Motivation is everything. Really. If the dog is not enjoying the work with you, you might pass the CD title, but the chances of passing Open or Utility are not that great. Your dog needs to LOVE the work.

Rule number three. Don’t enter a trial until your dog is really ready. That means you can work at the dog park, in parking lots, near a playground full of kids or a baseball game... and the dog doesn’t lose focus.

Let’s look at a couple of “challenging” behaviors (it’s no coincidence that they are duration behaviors).

Heeling. Heel is the first behavior your dog is asked to perform every time you go in the obedience ring. It’s the behavior you spend the most of your “performance time” doing. It’s also inherently boring. So how do you make it “not boring”? Consider “life rewards”. What is your dog distracted by? Can you make that a reward for good heeling? Are the squirrels in your yard making it impossible for your dog to work? Try a few steps of heel followed by “get the squirrel!” (Assuming of course that your dog can’t actually *catch* the squirrel.) How about the dog that’s playing ball at the park? Ask for a little heel work, then pull out your own ball! Train with your dog’s best friend: Heel, heel, go play!

Remember also that every time you allow your dog’s focus to wander while he’s heeling, you’re training him to disengage. If your dog’s attention breaks away from you, stop right there. Remind him what he’s supposed to be doing and start again. After you’ve had a “corrective moment” (this is not a “correction”, just stopping the activity to remind the dog), heel for a few steps then reward with play or treats – whatever is better than the distraction for your dog. Don’t send the dog to the distraction right away, but keep it in mind for a future reward!

Stay. The key to a solid stay is adding time and distractions before you add distance. Stay is another inherently boring behavior so you don’t want your dog to learn to self-reward (running around the room is a lot more fun than sitting still for three minutes). Plan your stay work. Increase the difficulty of one criteria at a time.

So, let’s say you’re going to work on time today (that’s one criteria). Go from 5 seconds to 15 seconds, then 9 seconds, then 25 seconds. Sometimes it’s harder (your goal is 5 minutes), sometimes it’s easier. Don’t always just increase the duration – your dog won’t have fun with that, sometimes it’s really easy, sometimes it’s hard.

Once your stay is up to 1 minute, start working on distractions (that’s your next criteria). Go back to 5 – 15 seconds with another dog working in the room, start building your time back up with that level of distraction. When you are back up to a minute or more, make the distraction harder (a dog playing ball in the room) and reduce your time criteria again.

Only when your dog is up to 3-4 minutes of stay with a lot of heavy distractions is it time to start leaving your dog. Same idea as before, start small (one or two steps away) with short time and minimal distractions. Don’t increase all the criteria back up at once, add more distance OR more time OR more distractions. Yes, it takes time to build a solid foundation for stay – but it’s worth it when you get to the ring and you can relax once you’ve passed the individual exercises!

Building a solid foundation does take time. But if you prepare and systematically create a solid foundation, your “house of heeling” will survive “ring stress” when you start competing!

Have a great summer with your dogs, play train and spend some time relaxing!

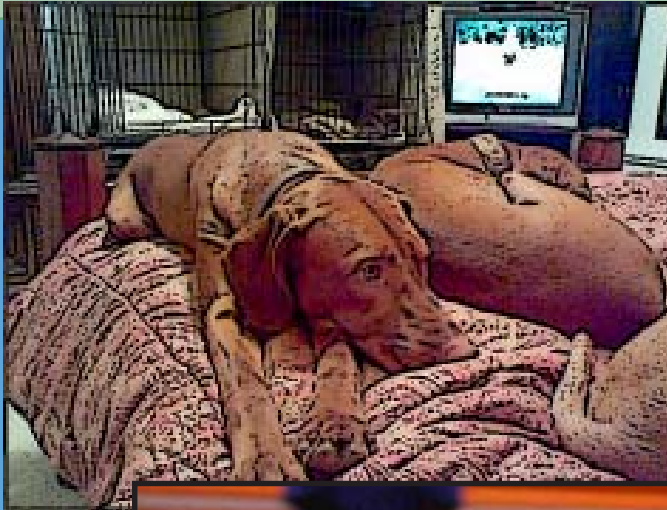
